Former State Representative Alvin T. Amaral

WHEREAS, Alvin T. Amaral was born on December 1, 1927 in Puunene, Maui and attended St. Anthony High School; and


WHEREAS, Alvin T. Amaral served as a delegate to the 1968 Hawai'i State Constitutional Convention, was a member of the Hawai'i State House of Representatives for Kahului, Maui from 1973 through 1976, served as a delegate to the 1976 Republican National Convention, was a former Maui County Councilmember from 1977 through 1978, and was a former realtor and land developer; and

WHEREAS, Alvin T. Amaral was the recipient of many awards including the Hawai'i Outstanding Advocate for Children and Youth, the Department of Health Sustained Superior and Exemplary Performance Award, the National Association of Social Workers Hawai'i Chapter Lifetime Achievement Award and the Jonathan Won Child Maltreatment Prevention Award; and

WHEREAS, Alvin T. Amaral is survived by his wife Dorothy "Dottie"; sons, Alvin, Jr., Russell, and Jeffrey; brothers, Gilbert and Bernard; sister, Mildred Cambra; granddaughter, Jackie Amaral; and great-grandchildren, Corey Kahalewai and Kayla Leong;
