In Recognition of

National Day of Prayer

WHEREAS, the 65th observance of the National Day of Prayer will be held on Thursday, May 5, 2016; and

WHEREAS, established in 1952 by an act of Congress, this tradition has become a treasured part of our nation's heritage of faith; and

WHEREAS, Americans across the country will gather to pray for wisdom and guidance in places of worship; and

WHEREAS, this fundamental right is guaranteed by our nation's First Amendment to the Constitution; and

WHEREAS, this national observance strives to reaffirm the importance of prayer and worship; and

WHEREAS, on O'ahu, the National Day of Prayer Task Force/Island Network of Prayer/UPCI will hold an event at the Hawai'i State Capitol rotunda at 6:30 p.m.;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, SHAN S. TSUTSUI, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim May 5, 2016 as

“NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER”

in Hawai'i, and encourage the citizens of the Aloha State to give thanks, in harmony with their own faiths and consciences, for our many freedoms and blessings.
