



Proclamation

In Recognition of

2018 International Assistance Dog Week

WHEREAS, assistance dogs are dogs that transform and improve the lives of their human partners who live with physical and/or mental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, in addition to helping their human partners complete essential, day-to-day tasks and activities like walking, dressing, and doing laundry, assistance dogs are also devoted companions, best friends, and close family members; and

WHEREAS, there are several types of assistance dogs, including service dogs, seizure response dogs, service dogs for children with autism, and combination dogs; and

WHEREAS, service dogs assist people with physical disabilities and neurological disorders with tasks such as retrieving items, pulling wheelchairs, pushing buttons, and reminding them to take prescribed medications; and

WHEREAS, seizure alert and response dogs are trained to assist people with epilepsy, panic attacks, strokes, or post-traumatic stress disorder by activating life-alert systems, preventing injuries, and supporting the rehabilitation process; and

WHEREAS, service dogs for children with autism help autistic children and their families by disrupting repetitive behaviors, preventing meltdowns, and keeping children from wandering away; and

WHEREAS, highly skilled assistance dog trainers can train any breed of dog for a life of service, and training often begins when puppies are only a few weeks old and can last for months or years; and


WHEREAS, International Assistance Dog Week provides an opportunity to raise awareness of the selfless service assistance dogs provide their human partners;

THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, DOUGLAS S. CHIN, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i, do hereby proclaim August 5 - 11, 2018 as


“ASSISTANCE DOG WEEK”
