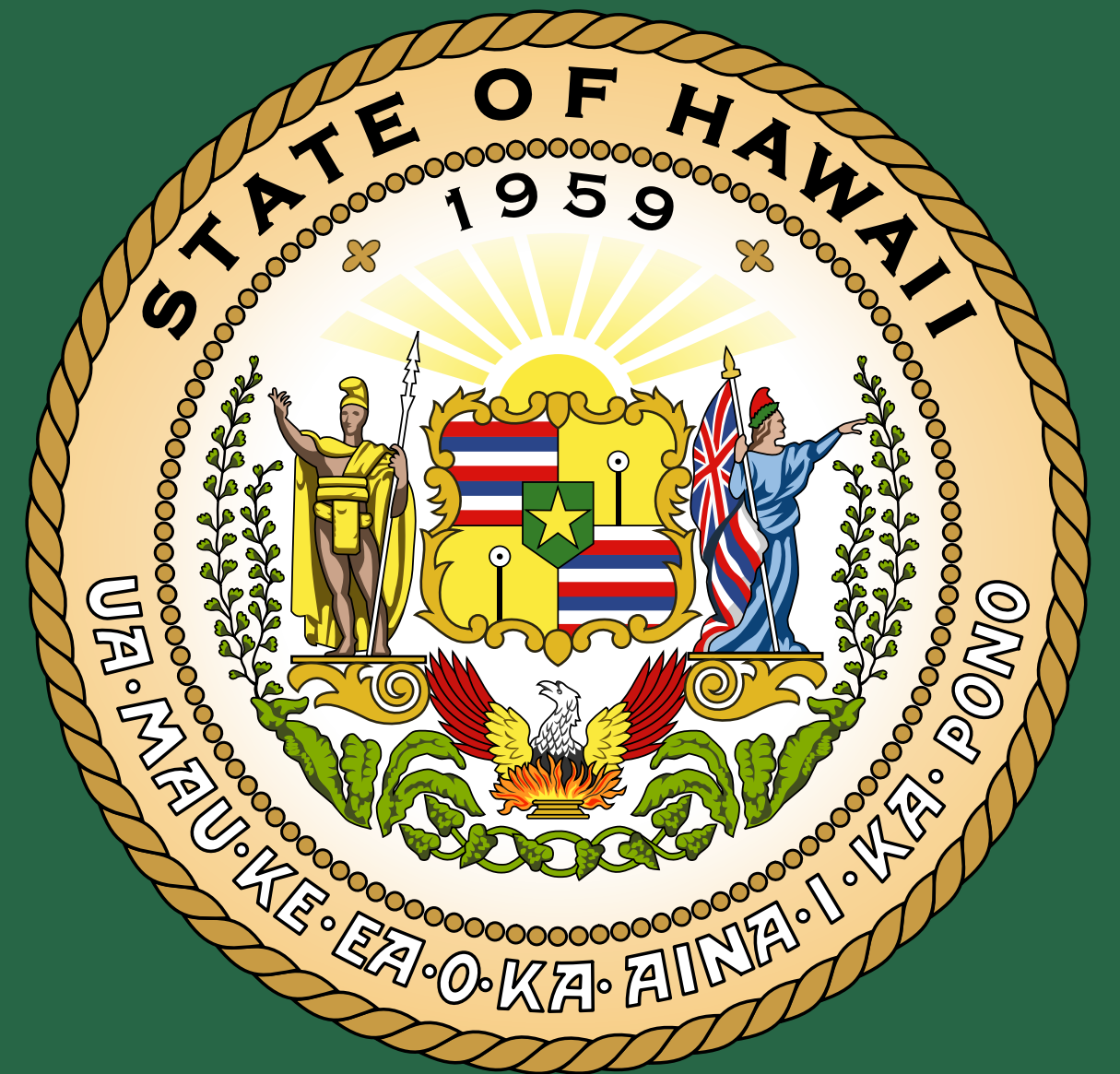

# Grants-In-Aid

On December 19, 2022, Governor Josh Green released nearly \$50 million in grants to non-profit communities. The grants-in-aid were previously delayed, and Gov. Green worked with the Attorney General's Office and the Department of Budget and Finance to prioritize releasing these funds.





# Hawai'i Life Flight

On Governor Josh Green issued an Emergency Proclamation that helped to ensure availability of emergency transportation for every critically ill patient. Together, we collaboratively worked with our state, county, and healthcare industry partners and successfully maintained air medical transport statewide.



# Streamlined Housing



---

Governor Josh Green signed an emergency proclamation on the floor of the State Legislature—on Day Fifty of the administration. The emergency proclamation initiated a process for **streamlining select housing projects**, with due consideration given to issues like respect for ‘iwi kupuna and historical landmarks.



# Our Kauhale Program



On January 26, construction for the first Kauhale on Hawai'i Island was initiated in Kealahou. **This is the first Kauhale to be built on a neighbor island.** Through coordination with county leaders like Mayor Mitch Roth, we'll be building more in the near future. It will not be the last Kauhale—it is only the beginning.



# Restoring Trust in Government

Governor Josh Green is championing legislation which decreases the cost of access to government documents. He has publicly pledged to hold the **Office of Information Practices** to a higher standard, especially where the process-time for the **Uniform Information Practices Act** to produce requested information has grown too long.



# A Green Climate Agenda

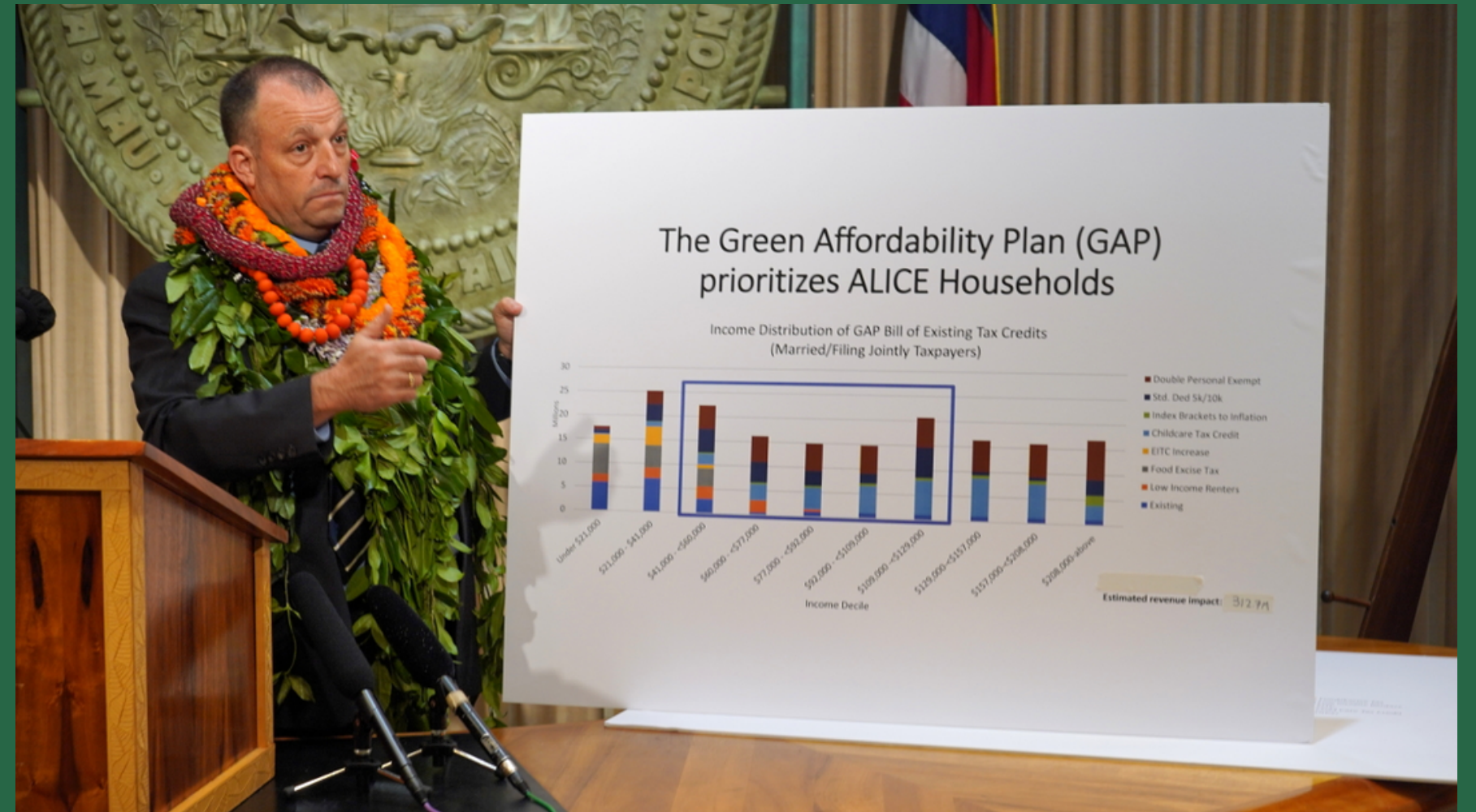

Governor Josh Green has spearheaded a **Green Fee** proposal presently making its way through the Legislature, a **Climate Impact Fund**, and a new **Climate Change Commission** to be co-chaired by the Directors of the Department of Land and Natural Resources and the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development.

# National Governors Association

Governor Josh Green traveled to Washington D.C. and joined federal officials and leaders from business, academia, and philanthropy for solutions-driven conversations around the top issues in states and territories. Gov. Green had meetings with cabinet secretaries for the U.S. Departments of Housing and Urban Development, Transportation and Health and Human Services, and the Secretary and Assistant Secretary of the Navy.

## **HTA Contract**

Within the next two months, HTA will be evaluating and awarding two contracts for U.S. Brand Marketing and destination management services.

## **Protecting Reproductive Rights**

On reproductive justice, the legislature is currently reviewing a bill that will protect doctors who perform abortions in Hawai'i.

## **Aloha Stadium**

In the coming weeks, two requests for proposals will be released to begin the demolition and development of a new Aloha Stadium.
