We have not received documentation as of this date of termination of funds or cessation of programs at this date, however, the Community Services Block

Grant office has closed with all of its employees terminated in Washington, DC and DHUD has had 400 + employees terminated.

Further, the "Fig Beautiful Bill" before Congress which is closed is \$0.00 funded for CSBG and Liheap and WAP programs.

In essence, at this time there is no documentation, however real concern or elimination of funds and programs affecting those in dire need.

Background and Summary

Applicant Background

Kauai Economic Opportunity, Incorporated is the statutorily designated Community Action Agency serving those in need since 1965, a 501 (c)3 private non profit organization. It has served Kauai's residents for the past 60 years.

Funding Request Purpose .

The goals and objectives of the request include: The following objectives are currently scheduled to be accomplished with Federal Funds received through State of HI Agencies or directly from the Federal Sources and are endangered funds scheduled to be eliminated by the current Administration and Congressional Budget. Providing a multitude of services for economically disadvantaged in the following areas: Homeless Emergency Shelter: The only Emergency Shelter Program on Kauai provides shelter 7 days a week, 24 hours per day, approximately 14,600 bed nights and more than 29,000 meals per year for the homeless on Kauai. KEO provides more than 38 units of Transitional Shelter housing per year, which houses many households as they transition to permanent housing. KEO provides 4 Section 8 units for disabled elderly. KEO provides more than 400 household Energy and Weatherization Assistance in a year.

Geographic Coverage Served The geographic coverage is the whole island of Kauai.

Public Purpose or **Need Served** The public purpose and need to be served would be to house the Homeless on Kauai. The most recent count of homeless on Kauai was more than 400 who agreed to be counted and many more not documented.

Another public need is to provide energy and weatherization service to maintain important utilities and services to preserve health, safety and life by reducing the cost and improving the efficiency of needed utilities such as electricity and gas, life required utilities.

Target Population Served

The target population is the economically disadvantaged meeting the requirements and eligibility standards of each program which may include the poverty standards of the Federal Poverty guidelines, homelessness. and other eligibility requirements. The programs serve all age groups.

Summary and Outcomes

Measure(s) of Effectiveness

The most vital and important outcome would be the continuation of the terminated Federal Programs providing basic life needs housing for homeless, utilities for health and safety--most basic needs to maintain life!

As per measurement of the objectives:]

As these are most basic life needs services measurement for the Homeless Emergency Shelter will be: Number of Individuals and Households served.

Number of bed nights provided.

Number of case managemt sessions provided.

Number of Housing Plans created and the number of achievement of the activities expected on the Plan. Number acchieving transitional or permanent housing.

For the Weatherization and Energy Conservation Program:

The number of households receiving energy costs assistance.

The number of households receiving the installation of energy saving devices and monitoring energy consumption to record savings.

Number receiving energy consumption education.

Other requirements by the expending agency will be further provided.

Projected Annual Timeline All outcomes and services stated in the Description and Scope of Services are projected, as well as the current operational timeline, for a year of service.

The Outcomes are also stated in the Scope above.

Quality Assurance and Evaluation Plans If funded we will implement the requirements of the current programs expected to be terminated.

In essence for the programs stated quality has already been determined whether it is by the facilities provided, meals served, devices installed, and other services such as case management.

Evaluative activities require number of days in a program, achievement of permanent housing, implementation of a housing plan for homelessness, while it would be energy savings and efficiency calculation for house holds receiving energy assistance.

Scope of Work

As per the Emergency Shelter of the Homeless, KEO will provide in a year approximately 14,600 bed nights, 29,000 meals and case management services for all occupants toward self sufficiency and permanent housing. The ultimate outcome is housing the homeless population on Kauai.

For the Transitional Housing, approximately 100 households will be temporarily housed while intensive case management activities will be provided towards achieving and maintaining permanent housing. The ultimate outcome is providing housing while preparing participants to obtain permanent housing--and ultimately achieving permanent housing.

Energy assistance will be provided more than 400 households in assistance by way of providing energy credits towards their utilities costs, the installation of energy assistance devices such as solar heaters, refrigerators, light bulbs and others, educational information on energy conservation etc. The ultimate outcome is providing life required utilities by reducing the cost of such utilities by installation of energy saving devices and/or credits towards the cost of the utilities.
